Instructions: Answer the following questions choosing "a" or "b" to get an idea of whether you are right-brain dominant or left-brain dominant.

- 1. I prefer to deal with:
 - a. Concepts and ideas
 - b. Facts
- 2. The people I work with would say that I:
 - a. Like to shake things up.
 - b. Play it safe.
- 3. I perform best when:
 - a. I can "wing" it from start to end.
 - b. I have a detailed rules and procedures to guide me.
- 4. When I look for solutions to problems, I rely on:
 - a. Intuition
 - b. Logic
- 5. People have criticized me for:
 - a. not being detailed oriented
 - b. focusing too much on details
- 6. Which statement best describes how you approach your work?
 - a. What if I try a new way?
 - b. Let's stick to ways we know work.
- 7. When I make presentations, I:
 - Use lots of color and artwork.
 - b. Use lots of statistics, charts, and graphs
- 8. When I have a problem with people who work for me, I:
 - a. Try to understand their viewpoint and work with them to find a solution.
 - b. Tell them what they need to do to fix the problem and expect them to fix it.
- 9. My friends and coworkers would say that I'm:
 - a. More focused on the big picture than the short term.
 - b. More focused on the short term than the big picture.
- 10. When I communicate, I:
 - a. Begin by setting a positive tone to avoid hurting feelings.
 - b. Make my point quickly and concisely and wait for a response.

Scoring: Give yourself a point for every "a" answer. Subtract a point for every "b" answer.

- The closer you're total score is to 10 points, the more likely it is that you're using your creative, right side of the brain most of the time.
- The closer you're total score is to a minus 10 points, the more likely it is that you're using your logical, left side of the brain most of the time.
- The closer you're total score is to zero, the more likely it is that you're using <u>both</u> the creative right side of your brain and the logical left.
